RE: Report of Police Department for October 2025

The Town of Chester Police Department remained active in the community in October. We continued to maintain our objective of community commitment, while taking a proactive stance towards detecting crime and enforcing the laws. In October, the police department responded to **275 calls for service**. Officers drove **16,534 miles** during the month.

A breakdown of the criminal and non-criminal activity for the month is included below:

CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

The Town of Chester Police Department made **5 arrests** during the month. A summary of the arrests is as follows:

- 1 arrested on an outstanding arrest warrant
- 2 charged with Operating a motor vehicle with a Suspended Driver License
- 1 charged with Trespass
- 1 charged with Failure to License a Dog

NON-CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

In addition to the arrests listed above, officers also responded to other calls for service in October. A summary of those calls for service is as follows:

- 32 medical calls
- 20 residential & commercial burglary or fire alarms
- 11 reports of suspicious persons, vehicles or activity
- 7 domestic disputes, disturbances, fights, or other disputes

- 4 motor vehicle crashes with injuries
- 7 motor vehicle crashes without injuries
- 5 motor vehicle crashes involving deer

COMMUNITY POLICING

During the month, Town of Chester police officers assisted members of the community in many ways. Some of the community policing activity is listed below.

Officers completed **2 house security checks and 1093 business security checks** in October.

Sergeant Dugan and Officers Bird, Weinstein, Stack and Narain continue to complete child passenger safety seat checks and installations when needed.

Officers assisted with traffic control during the 2nd annual Sugar Loaf 5K on October 4th.

Officer Stack maintained contact with the Chester Golden Age Club. A presentation on prevalent scams involving seniors was made at the senior center on October 15th with the assistance of Village of Chester PD Detective Grosso.

The PBA set up a station manned by off-duty and on-duty officers at the town's annual Trunk-or-Treat event held at the Sugar Loaf PAC on October 25th.

TRAINING

Departmental monthly training was held on October 16th at the senior center and included all town employees on the annual mandatory topics required by PESH and our insurance company including sexual harassment, bloodborne pathogens, workplace violence, etc.

Chief Doellinger attended the International Association of Chiefs of Police conference in Denver from October 18th to 21st.

Semi-annual firearms qualification was concluded in October at the range in Port Jervis.

MISCELLANEOUS

Officers were assigned to the high school football games at the Chester Commons Park on October 3rd and 17th.

Commercial vehicle enforcement details were held on October 7th and 21st with the NYS Department of Transportation. Twelve vehicles were inspected and eight unsafe vehicles were taken out of service with major violations.

Chief Doellinger and Administrative Sgt Vitale attended an Orange County Awards Ceremony in Hamptonburgh on October 1st where Officer Contino received a Lifesaving award for his role in a rescue in June.

Officers monitored traffic during the Best Buddies Bike Tour from the Glenmere Mansion on October 4th.

Officer Calderone assisted the Town of Warwick PD with Applefest on October 5th and a large gathering on October 18th.

Officer Dunlop and K9 Lou performed pre-event explosives detection sweeps at Applefest in Warwick on October 5th and in Sugar Loaf before the annual Fall Festival on October 11th and 12th.

School Resource Officers Santosky-Wright, DeLuca and Donato were assigned to the Chester Academy and Chester Elementary Schools in October.

There were three letters of thanks received in October. One was from the organizers of the Sugar Loaf 5K thanking us for our assistance. The second was from a resident thanking Officer Maglione for his assistance with a traffic hazard. The third was from the Town of Warwick Police Department acknowledging our assistance with Applefest. Copies are attached.

Part-time police officers were used for 191.5 hours of patrol coverage (190.5 regular hours and 1 overtime hour).
