**RE: Report of Police Department for March 2025**

The Town of Chester Police Department remained active in the community in March. We continued to maintain our objective of community commitment, while taking a proactive stance towards detecting crime and enforcing the laws. In March, the police department responded to **243 calls for service**. Officers drove **16,567 miles** during the month.

A breakdown of the criminal and non-criminal activity for the month is included below:

## CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

The Town of Chester Police Department made **10 arrests** during the month. A summary of the arrests is as follows:

- 1 charged with Assault in the third degree and Harassment in the second degree
- 9 charged with Operating a motor vehicle with a Suspended Registration or Suspended Driver License

## NON-CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

In addition to the arrests listed above, officers also responded to other calls for service in March. A summary of those calls for service is as follows:

- 28 medical calls
- 16 residential, commercial or automatic fire alarms
- 14 reports of suspicious persons, vehicles or activity
- 14 domestic disputes, family court matters and other disputes
  
- 2 motor vehicle crashes with injuries
- 7 motor vehicle crashes without injuries
- 2 motor vehicle crashes involving deer

## COMMUNITY POLICING

During the month, Town of Chester police officers assisted members of the community in many ways. Some of the community policing activity is listed below.

Officers completed **1172 business security checks** in March.

Sergeant Dugan and Officers Bird, Weinstein, Stack and Narain continue to complete child passenger safety seat checks and installations when needed. There were three seat checks completed in March.

Officer Santosky-Wright was in contact with the Sugar Loaf Chamber of Commerce and will assist with planning for their annual Spring Festival on May 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>.

Officer Stack remained in contact with Senior Center staff and members of the seniors' group.

Officer Gundermann was in contact with a leader from the local Girl Scout troop regarding a request for an upcoming presentation.

## TRAINING

Officer Weinstein attended the Instructor Development Course at the police academy in Middletown from March 3<sup>rd</sup> through March 14<sup>th</sup>.

Officer Santosky-Wright attended the Basic School Resource Officer course in Marlborough from March 3<sup>rd</sup> through March 7<sup>th</sup>.

## MISCELLANEOUS

Commercial vehicle enforcement details were held on March 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> with the NYS Department of Transportation. Twelve vehicles were inspected and four unsafe vehicles were taken out of service with major violations.

Officer DeLuca was present at the Chester Academy for the school's Harlem Wizards basketball game charity event on the evening of March 10<sup>th</sup>.

Officers assisted with the funeral escort detail for former Highway Superintendent Dave Bell on March 13<sup>th</sup>.

TRU Officers Calderone and DeLuca were part of a Quick Reaction Force detail in Goshen for the Mid-Hudson St. Patrick's Day Parade on March 16<sup>th</sup>. Officer Dunlop and K9 Lou participated in a pre-event explosives sweep the morning of the parade.

Officers were present to assist with a wish-granting presentation by the Make-A-Wish foundation at Shop Rite on March 30<sup>th</sup>.

We continued to provide School Resource Officers to the Chester Union Free School District. Officers Perez, DeLuca and Donato were assigned to provide coverage at the Chester Academy and the Chester Elementary School.
