RE: Report of Police Department for July 2026

The Town of Chester Police Department remained active in the community in July. We continued to maintain our objective of community commitment, while taking a proactive stance towards detecting crime and enforcing the laws. In July, the police department reported **467 incidents**. Officers drove **15,186 miles** during the month.

A breakdown of the criminal and non-criminal activity for the month is included below:

CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

The Town of Chester Police Department made **13 arrests** during the month. A summary of the arrests is as follows:

- 6 charged with Operating a Motor Vehicle with a Suspended Driver License and/or Registration
- 1 charged with Felony Assault, Obstructing Govt Administration and 2 counts of Reckless Driving
- 1 charged with Driving While Intoxicated
- 1 charged with Trespass and Harassment
- 1 charged with Trespass
- 1 charged with Creating Unreasonable Noise
- 1 taken into custody on an outstanding warrant of arrest
- 1 taken into custody for Emergency Admissions of the Mentally Ill

NON-CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

In addition to the arrests listed above, officers also responded to other calls for service in July. A summary of those calls for service is as follows:

- 35 medical calls
- 20 animal complaints
- 16 residential & commercial burglary or fire alarms
- 16 welfare checks
- 11 hazardous conditions
- 10 reports of suspicious persons, vehicles or activity
- 2 motor vehicle crashes with injuries
- 11 motor vehicle crashes without injuries
- 4 motor vehicle crashes involving deer

Officers were present to patrol on foot, by bicycle and by UTV during the town's annual fireworks event on July 11th.

An officer was assigned to foot patrol during the Voices of Liberty show at Sugar Loaf Crossing on July 19th.

Chief Doellinger attended a Law Enforcement Appreciation event in Alpine, NJ on July 29th hosted by Rabbi Abe Friedman and the Palisades Interstate Parkway Police.
